- 1. Review the supplies and note when you need to have certain items ready
 - Order and shop for what you need.
- 2. Label 25 envelopes #1-#25.
 - *A note on envelopes*: They can be as simple or fancy as you want. You can use purchased or fashion a simple pocket from construction or scrap book paper.
- 3. Cut apart the Advent instruction cards and place them in the corresponding envelope. (i.e. The December 1st card goes into to the #1 envelope.)
- 4. Set out the stable for your nativity. Keep back the pieces that you will hide for the Nativity Scavenger Hunt.
 - If you do not have one there is a printable version at the end of the document. Print out the blank stable scene and nativity pieces on the following page. Cut the pieces out. As they are found glue or tape them on to the blank stable scene.

Prep-work:

- *Dec. 1st:* Wrap up a Christmas Story book of your choosing. Label it 'December 1st' set it out on the first day with envelope #1.
- Dec. 2nd: Hide the angel in the Kitchen
- Dec. 3rd: Hide Mary in the Dining Room/ Area
- *Dec. 4th:* You may want to pre-screen or choose an activity or charity to donate to that helps single moms/ women. A Houston favorite is Mission of Yahweh https://missionofyahweh.org/
- Dec. 5th: Hide Joseph in your home's entry area or foyer.
- *Dec. 6th:* Package half the coins, label with a #6, and place with the #6 envelope. Package the other half separately, label with a #18, and put with #18 envelope.
- *Dec. 8th:* Hide the manger near your child(ren)'s play area or playroom.



Prep-work (continued):

- **Dec. 9th:** Hide the sheep in the office or near the home computer.
- *Dec. 10th:* Hide any extra nativity animals, like donkeys or camels, around the Living Room.
- *Dec. 11th:* Brainstorm ideas on how to show favor to someone spend time with them, pray for them, give a small thoughtful gift, help them with a chore, draw them a picture, make a Christmas card
- Dec. 12th: If choosing to gift an atlas wrap and put with the #12 envelope.
- *Dec. 13th:* If you choose to give new PJs wrap them and put them with the #13 envelope.
- Dec. 14th: Hide the wise men in the Living Room.
- Dec. 15th: Assemble the star making supplies.
- *Dec. 16th:* Prepare for star gazing and carols. Maybe select a Christmas station and have a <u>Bluetooth speaker</u> available. If it will be chilly have hot cocoa, <u>blankets</u>, and jackets ready.
- *Dec. 17th:* Choose a joyful family movie to watch. If necessary, find out when it will air and set up a recording, buy, or borrow it.
- *Dec. 19th:* Print the Christmas Mad Libs-style activities and add them to the #19 envelope.
- *Dec. 20th:* Prepare the Spelling Stones (see specific page instructions). Package them and place them with envelope #20. If Spelling Stones are too juvenile for your kids switch it out for another word-centric activity like a crossword puzzle book or a game like Boggle or Bananagrams.
- **Dec. 21st:** Make sure you have your cookie making supplies on hand. It doesn't have to be fancy. If a tube is involved that is a-okay!
- *Dec. 22nd:* Tonight is fire and marshmallows. Have your supplies ready!
- *Dec. 23rd:* Acquire your chosen gingerbread house, wrap and label it 'December 23rd', place with the #23 envelope
- Dec. 24th: Hide the baby Jesus in the Kitchen.

 - o This can be ordered but often during the season it is easily found at grocery stores, Hobby Lobby, or other party stores
- The Complete Illustrated Children's Bible Atlas or a Map or any atlas of the Middle East
- New PJs
- Star Ornament instructions and supplies page
 - o 5 <u>Cinnamon Sticks</u> or twigs about the diameter of a pencil, cut to equal lengths
 - <u>Hot Glue & gun</u>
 - String or Ribbon
 - Optional: Decorations
- Joyful Christmas movie of your choice
- Hot Cocoa
- Christmas Mad Libs-style Printouts
- Spelling Stones instructions and supplies or a different wordcentric activity like <u>crossword puzzles</u> or a game (<u>Boggle</u> or <u>Bananagrams</u>)

In this passage it specifically refers to God's blessings. Think of a way to be a blessing or bless someone else.




luke 2: 15-18
